

The North Jersey Local Section has the resources to provide our members with a wide variety of activities—technical meetings, special symposia, short courses, career services, and public outreach activities. We offer programs for chemists at all degree levels. There are a variety of activities for student members and younger chemists as well as for senior chemists.

STUDENT MEMBERS

Undergraduates in the North Jersey area who are majoring in Chemistry are welcomed as members by the ACS with reduced membership fees.
